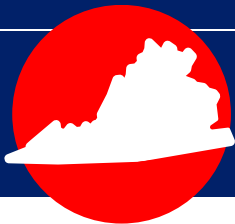

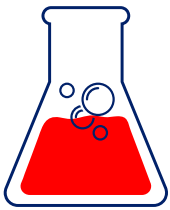

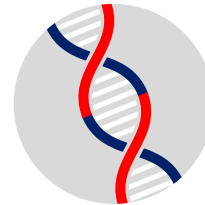

HOPE LODGE

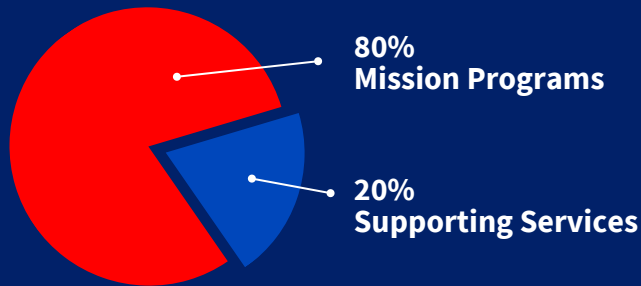

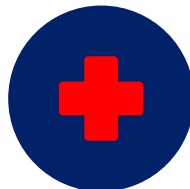

GET SCREENED

is a campaign to encourage patients to resume appropriate cancer screening and follow up care. 1 in 2 men and 1 in 3 women will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime.



EARLY DETECTION

of cancer through screening reduces mortality from cancers of the colon and rectum, breast, uterine, cervix and lung.



HEALTH EQUITY

means everyone has a fair and just opportunity to prevent, find, treat, and survive cancer. It is a moral imperative if we are to meet our 2035 goal of reducing cancer mortality by 40%.
